

Digital Public Library of America

- DPLA amplifies the value of libraries and equips them with tools to make information more accessible
- Provides access to over 45 million images, text, videos and sounds from across the US
- Service Hub
 - Represents a community of institutions
 - Provides aggregated metadata from partners to DPLA through a single data feed
 - Metadata resolves to digital objects



Welcome Back!

- Kicked off the discussion of a RI Hub on July 11, 2018 with DPLA
- Met at Salve Regina August 17, 2018
- Had an online meeting November 11, 2018
- Created a Steering Committee in Fall 2018 by email
- Did a successful survey in fall 2018, with follow-up in spring 2019
- Convened our first Steering Committee Meeting at PPL on February 26, 2019 to disseminate survey results
- Brown, Providence Public, and OLIS continued conversations in Fall 2019 into Winter 2020

History

Initial Survey (Dec 2018)

- 64 responses
 - 70% of respondents had digital collections
 - 44% host digital collections
 - 23 public, 8 academic, 3 special libraries
 - 10 historical/preservation societies, 9 museums/historic sites
 - 96% of collections included photographs, manuscripts, artifacts
 - 38% included online exhibits
 - Wide range of hosting platforms and staffing situations

Process

- Identify collections ready for an inaugural DPLA-RI collection launch (Summer 2022)
- Committee onboarding and finalize membership agreements
- Complete DPLA Service Hub application (Su/Fall 2022)
 - OLIS to act as Fiscal Agent for initiative and pay membership fees
- Implementation
 - Training, setup and initial ingest
- Launch "DPLA-RI" repository (June 9, 2023)



Steering Committee

Responsible for providing strategic direction, facilitating operations, and managing the hub's general functions.

Metadata Committee

Responsible for creating and maintaining the necessary documentation to provide current and potential contributors to the hub with the information required to prepare their collections for inclusion in DPLA.

Systems Committee

Responsible for evaluating and recommending applications and infrastructure for the hub's aggregator. The systems committee works with the metadata committee to ensure data ingestion and with the hosting institution to guarantee that DPLA can harvest the hub's data.
