

Free Telecommunications Equipment for Eligible Individuals with Combined Hearing and Vision Loss

iCanConnect is a Federal Communication Commission (FCC) funded program, also referred to as the National Deaf-Blind Equipment Distribution Program (NDBEDP). iCanConnect provides free modern equipment and training for distance communication purposes to people with both significant vision and hearing loss, who meet disability and income guidelines.

iCanConnect is a nationwide program with local contacts to help people stay connected with friends, family, their community, and the world. Each U.S. state and territory has a certified organization responsible for the program, including the Perkins School for the Blind, which administers services in twenty-three states and territories. People eligible for iCanConnect services receive a personalized assessment to identify solutions to support their distance communication needs. Then, participants are provided with equipment and training that meets their specific situation. Examples of equipment might include smartphones, tablets, computers, or laptops, large print screen magnification software, and refreshable braille devices. In Rhode Island, the Talking Books Library is responsible for the National Deaf-Blind Equipment Distribution Program services in Rhode Island. NLS patrons should always check the catalog to see if we have a book before requesting it. Recommendations are reviewed for possible additions to the collection by the NLS Collection Development team, and only those published in the past five years will be considered. No personal information is collected on the Book Recommendation forms, and NLS cannot contact patrons about their requests.

NLS BARD Support: BARD Mobile for the Fire operating system; version 1.4.6 release

NLS has released BARD Mobile Kindle Fire version 1.4.6. This is the second in a series of releases designed to support native Amazon Kindle Fire OS development and Amazon accessibility functions, including VoiceView for screen reader and braille output support. This release includes several usability and accessibility enhancements, including improved color contrast and text sizing. Some issues related to the VoiceView have been resolved. A few bug fixes have also been

implemented to enhance the user experience. Version 1.4.6 is supported by Fire tablets running 8.0 and above.

NLS BARD Support: BARD Mobile Android Version 2.0

NLS is releasing version 2.0 of the BARD Mobile Android app. This major release includes in-app search capability and several other feature updates, increased app stability, and bug fixes. This is the first in a series of planned releases to allow robust in-app searching and to eliminate the need to exit the app to search on the BARD website. With this update, BARD Mobile no longer includes the embedded view of the BARD website. Instead, it allows patrons to search within the app by keyword, author, title, or annotation and download the book directly to their Android devices from the search results listings. Updates on Two Ongoing Field Tests

Four network libraries (Pennsylvania, Texas, Oklahoma, and Utah) are participating in a field test of the next-generation digital, wifi-enabled talking-book player, DA-2s, and have begun distributing them to selected patrons. NLS is also conducting a field test of the Amazon Alexa smart speaker app. The app—a "skill" in Alexa lingo—allows users, via voice commands, to connect with BARD, search the collection, and stream books. This follows an initial test with 100 patrons last fall, which led to some refinements in the app. We hope to have more information in our next newsletter.

High Volume Players for Members with Hearing Loss

The High-Volume Player is for use by members of the talking books program with hearing loss. If you have hearing loss and vision loss or another issue preventing you from reading standard print materials, you can receive a high-volume player, which requires a separate application. The high-volume player and headphones are designed for use only by hearing-impaired patrons. This high-volume player and headphone combination will produce a sound level of up to 120 dB in adults. If you require greater amplification to listen to the recordings, this high-volume player and headphone combination is not suitable for you. Contact the talking books staff if you need an application.
